



You're on the Right Trail

The ancient face of Giant's Head Mountain stands 845 metres above the town of Summerland like a beacon. An extinct volcano, Giant's Head has been surveying its surroundings for thousands of years. You can take a variety of paths to the top for a panoramic view of Okanagan Lake and our fertile valley. Why Visit?

The Trans Canada Trail will be complete from coast to coast in 2017. Of the 600 km of the trail located in BC, 10% is in Summerland and follows the old Kettle Valley Rail line. Don't miss the highest bridge on the whole line, the Trout Creek Trestle Bridge, to see views that have been unchanged for thousands of years.

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Peaches and Beaches

Summerland roads meander past brilliant water views and lush orchards. While you're visiting enjoy beaches, wineries and cideries as well as local fruit markets and organic producers.

Okanagan Lake itself is 135 km (84 miles) long and up to 5 km (3.1 miles) wide in some spots with 270 km (170 miles) of shoreline. 5 of its spectacular beaches are located in Summerland.

When you're not swimming, sunbathing, waterskiing, boating or paddle boarding, you can also go fishing for rainbow trout or kokanee. And on the western slopes above the lake at Summerland you may see the resident herd of mountain goats.

No matter where in town you are you'll see that Summerland is the local's pick for an authentic Okanagan experience.
